

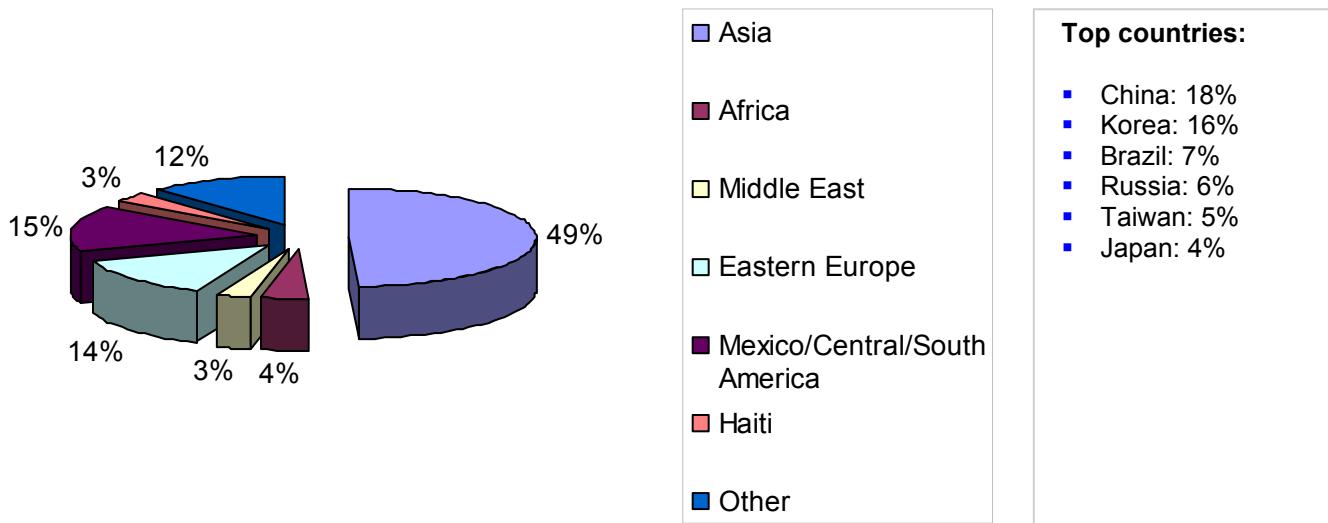

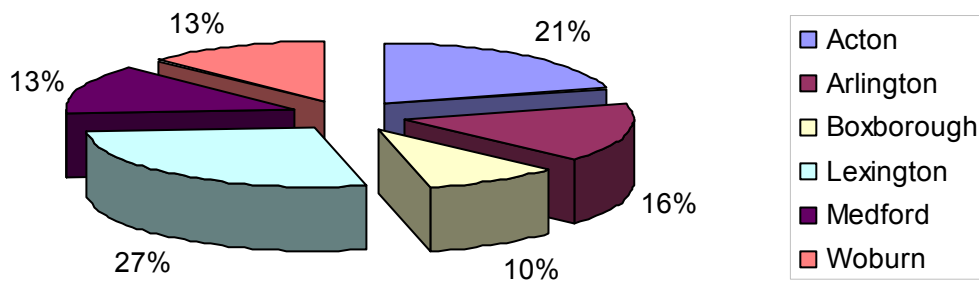

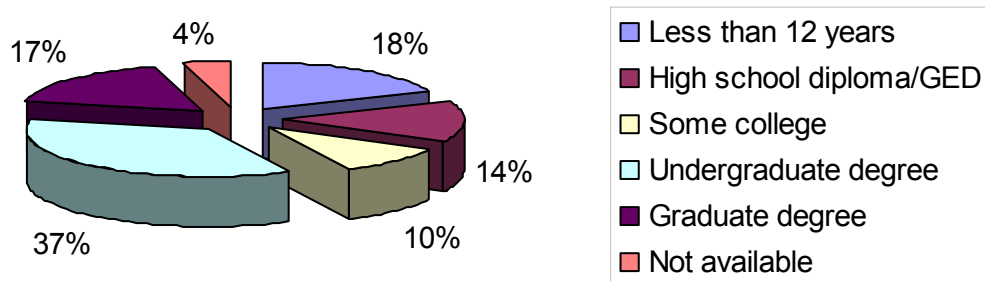
### Top Cities of Residence



## Learner Education

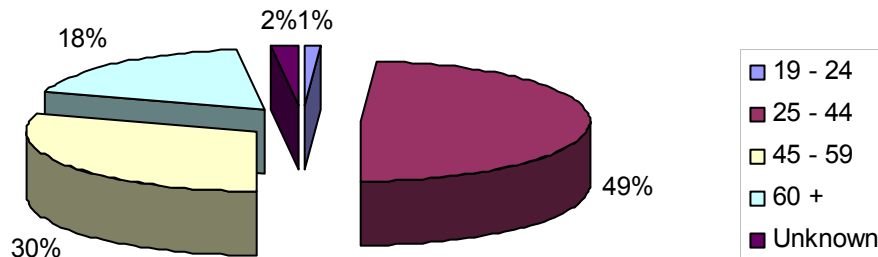
- 62% have at least some college

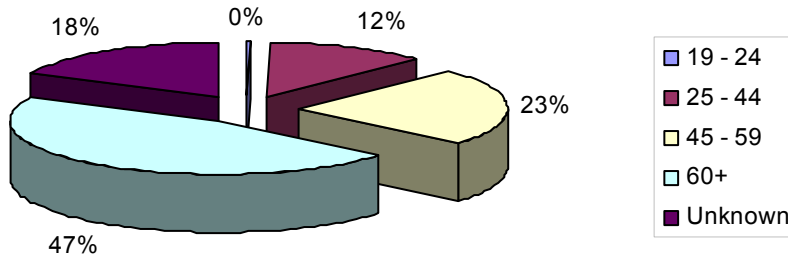
## Volunteer Participation across all English At Large programs

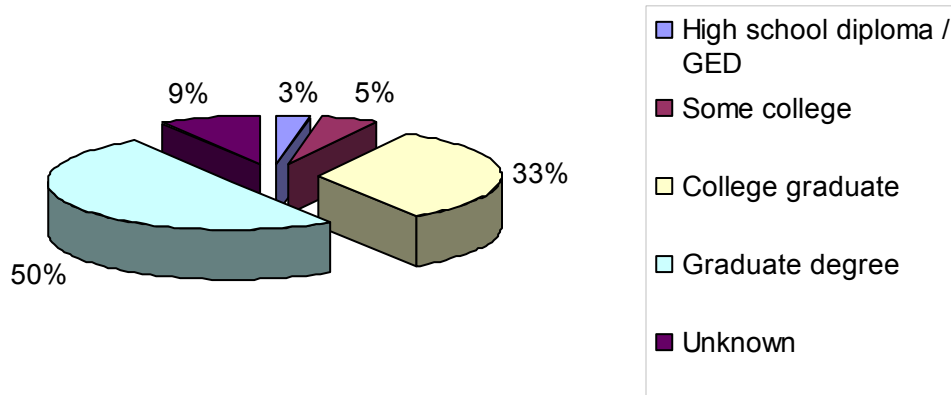


### Volunteer Gender

- 19% Male

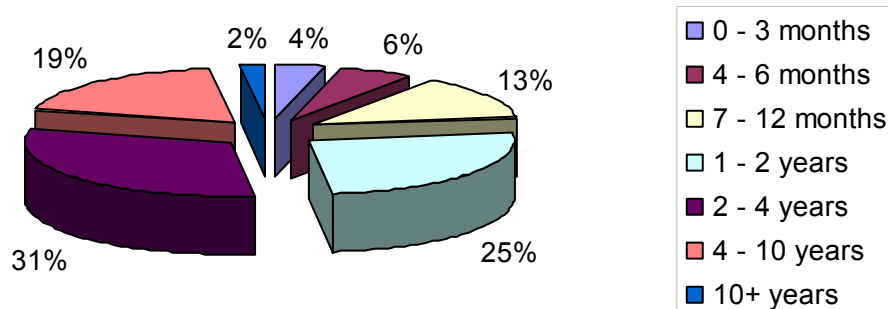
## Highest Educational Level Achieved by Volunteers

## Volunteer Retention

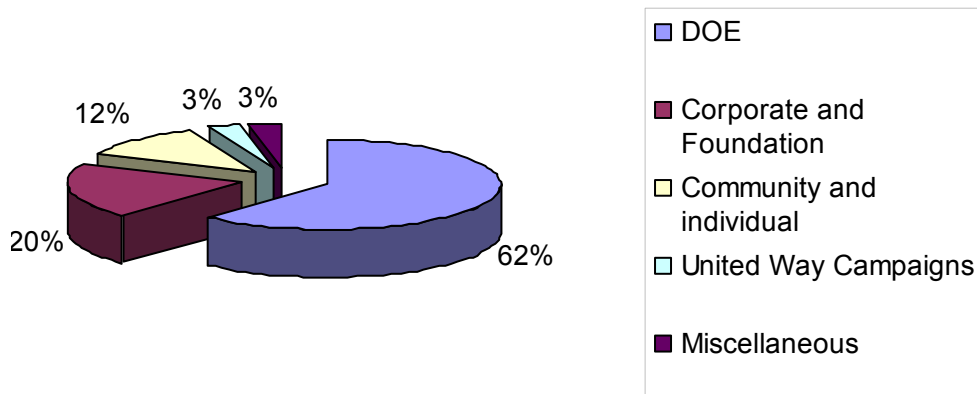
The majority of English At Large volunteers stay with the program for between 1 and 3 years. The duration of service for those who left English At Large during FY2007:



## Organizational Funding (FY2006 Numbers pending our FY2007 Financial Review)

### Funding Sources

The majority of English At Large funding comes from a competitive grant from the Massachusetts Department of Education (DOE). English At Large also receives regular support from the Acton-Boxborough United Way, and Citizens Bank. This year we also received support from Verizon.



### Funding Allocations

Generally 85% of English At Large income is dedicated to program costs. FY2006 expenses reflect a one-time rebranding effort that resulted in an organizational name change. We anticipate a return to our normal allocation for FY2007.
